WHAT IS THE SHELTON CHALLENGE?

The Shelton Challenge is a six-day summer experience for rising 9th-12th grade students. Shelton's five cornerstones of values-based leadership — honesty, integrity, diversity, social responsibility, and compassion — are the foundations of the camp. The core curriculum focuses on Personal Leadership Assessment and Interpersonal Dynamics, Role of Values and Ethics in Leadership, Leadership Traits and Approaches, Team-building and Empowering Others, Social Responsibility, Public Speaking, and Goal Setting. Students will have the opportunity to complete a service project, experience a high and low ropes course, coordinate events for their fellow campers, learn from six inter-generational instructors from various professional fields, and build a network of fellow youth leaders from around the country.

Expected Outcomes of Program

- Model General Hugh Shelton's values-based leadership principles and traits inclusive of honesty, integrity, diversity, social responsibility, and compassion.
- Assess baselined leadership skills and preferred practices using Kouzes and Posner's "Leadership Practices Inventory" and a 360-degree reflective model while incorporating assigned leadership roles throughout the week.
- Identify important leadership traits and competencies such as interpersonal skills, leadership styles, needs and skills assessment, teamwork, goal orientation,

motivating others, personal presence and public speaking, ethical decision making and changing behaviors.

- Engage in a youth-adult mentoring civic engagement model to enhance appreciation for social responsibility and inter-generational respect.
- Develop and practice skills related to self and team reflection to better understand deeper meanings while relating current experiences to future applications with the ultimate intent of continuous personal-quality improvement.
- Prepare a leadership self-development plan for accomplishment of short-term objectives and life-long goals.

 Applicant must be a rising 9th-12th grade student with a GPA of 3.0 (unweighted) or higher.

Cost of Program
